## **Trial of *Zinnia* from seed 2002**

### **An Invited RHS Trial**

The objective of the trial was to demonstrate and assess the habit and flowering performance of a range of *Zinnia* grown from seed, in the open ground.

Seed was sown in late April 2002 under glass into pans containing modular compost that had been drenched with Revive (a soil treatment of natural micro organisms which suppresses soil borne plant diseases) at a concentration of 1ml/l. The trays were then covered with 10mm of medium vermiculite and germinated at 20-25°C. The seedlings were pricked out into 9cm pots using a standard bedding mix, were watered in with Revive and were grown on at a minimum temperature of 18°C. Once the seedlings had reached their 2nd true leaf stage they were cooled down to 12°C at night with a 16°C day and then placed in a sheltered position outside to harden them off prior to their June planting. (*Zinnia* require warm nights so needed a later planting). The plants were treated with Hypoaspis to control Sciarid fly. Watering was controlled as excessive watering of the seedlings can make them prone to damping off.

20 plants of each self colour entry and 40 plants of each mixed colour entry were planted out on 14 June 2002. The dwarf and intermediate varieties were planted in blocks 30cm apart with 30 cm between plants. The tall varieties were planted in blocks 45cm apart with 45cm between plants.

Some 91 entries were submitted in the trial including 23 mixtures submitted by various seed companies in the UK and abroad. Members of the Floral Trials Sub-committee inspected the trial in July and September 2002 and recommended the Award of Garden Merit to 13 cultivars based on the following criteria:

colour : floriferousness : habit : weather resistance

The trial was duplicated at the Royal Horticultural Society's Garden at Harlow Carr.

#### **Pathology**

Some plants suffered from a leaf spot caused by the fungus *Alternaria zinniae*. This pathogen has also been observed separately in a wide range of composites including *Chrysanthemum*, *Dahlia*, *Gerbera*, *Helianthus* and *Tagetes* but does not appear to cause damage to these hosts at Wisley. This fungus is a potential problem for mass plantings and is associated with wet conditions and it was therefore not surprising that plants at Harlow Carr were particularly badly affected.

Plants can be treated with amateur products for use as protectant fungicides on ornamentals containing either penconazole or myclobutanil. Professional growers will be able to use the fungicide iprodione.

#### **Findings**

The Floral Trials Subcommittee was delighted at the success of this trial, which showed how useful these plants are for late colour. Maintenances were disappointingly variable in some cases, with old favourites such as 'Envy Double' showing a marked decline. Taller sorts required staking. It was noted that *Zinnia* prefer light soils and that direct sowing normally gives better plants. In any future trial it was agreed the plants should be given more space.

Harlow Carr proved not to be conducive to growing *Zinnia* when compared to Wisley, with many entries affected by the fungus *Alternaria zinniae*, and generally the plants lacking vigour. Of interest was the fact that different entries were considered AGM worthy at Harlow Carr and Wisley.

### **Zinnia (Benary's Giants Series) 'Benary's Giant Lilac' AGM (H3) 24 September 2002**

Raised and sent by Ernst Benary Samenzucht GmbH. Available from Moles Seeds. Votes 12 for with 2 against. [Trial No. 50]

Plant 110cm tall, spread 60-80cm, erect, vigorous, little branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, medium green. Flower stem 120cm long, erect, stout, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 10cm diameter, inconsistently semi-double, compact, held well above the foliage. Flowers variable colours; Red-Purple Group 71B tinged with Red-Purple Group N74A; Red-Purple Group 71C; Red-Purple Group 71D tinged with Red-Purple Group 72D. Ray petals 3cm long, 1.2cm wide, inflexed with slightly reflexed tips. Disc 2.5cm diameter, receptacular scales Red-Purple Group 58A, enlarged disc floret corolla yellow. 50 % Flowering from 25 July 2002.

*Wonderful dark cerise colour. Little mildew. Good for cutting as varying degrees of doubleness and lot of singles. Less variable than other Benary's Giants. Long flowering season.*

### **Zinnia (Dasher Series) 'Dasher Orange' AGM (H3) 10 September 2002**

Raised and sent by Bodger seeds Ltd. Votes 12 for with 3 against. [Trial No. 21]

Plant 60cm tall, spread 40cm, erect, compact, much branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, medium green. Flower stem 60cm long, erect, stout, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 7.5cm diameter, semi-double, compact, held well above the foliage. Flowers Orange-Red Group N30 C/D. Ray petals inflexed with slightly reflexed tips. Disc yellow, receptacular bracts Orange-Red Group 31A. 50 % flowering from 24 June 2002.

*Good bedding plant with small orange flower. Varying degree of doubleness.*

### **Zinnia (Dasher Series) 'Dasher Pink' AGM (H3) 29 August 2002**

Raised and sent by Bodger seeds Ltd. Votes 9 for with 1 against. [Trial No. 25]

Plant 55cm tall, spread 40cm, erect, compact, little branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, light to medium green. Flower stem 50cm long, erect, slender, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 7cm diameter, semi-double, loose, held well above the foliage. Flowers Red Group 49A. Ray petals 2.4cm long, 1cm wide, inflexed with slightly reflexed tips. Disc 2.3cm diameter, receptacular scales Orange-Red Group 31A and deeply lacinate, corolla lobes of disc florets densely pubescent, orange yellow. 50 % flowering from 24 June 2002.

*Dusty salmon pink flower.*

### **Z. Dreamland Series, mixed AGM (H3) 29 August 2002**

Raised and sent by Takii Europe BV. Votes 9 for with 0 against. [Trial No. 55]

Plant 48cm tall, spread 30-40cm, erect, compact, much branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, light to medium green. Flower stem 48cm long, erect, stout, occasionally hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 9cm diameter, semi-double, mixture of loose and compact, held at, above and below the foliage. Flowers a mixture of colours including cream, yellow, pale orange, dark orange, pale pink, dark pink and Scarlet. Ray petals approximately 3cm long, 1.5cm wide. Disc 1.5-3cm diameter. 50% flowering from 08 July 2002.

*Good mixture. Good balance of colours. Long flowering period. Excellent.*

### **Zinnia (Dreamland Series) 'Dreamland Rose' AGM (H3) 29 August 2002**

Raised and sent by Takii Europe BV. Votes 8 for with 1 against. [Trial No. 30]

Plant 45cm tall, spread 40cm, erect, compact, much branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, medium green. Flower stem 45cm long, erect, slender, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 8.5cm diameter, semi-double, compact held above the foliage. Flowers a colour close to Red-Purple Group N66A but colour more red and intense. Ray petals 3cm long, 0.8cm wide, reflexed at tips. Disc 2cm diameter, receptacular scales Red Group 46A, corolla lobes of disc florets a light bright yellow. 50 % flowering from 08 July 2002.

*Very vibrant bright pink colour. Good overall impression.*

**Zinnia (Dreamland Series) 'Dreamland Scarlet' AGM (H3) 10 September 2002**

Raised and sent by Takii Europe BV. Votes 13 for with 1 against. [Trial No. 43]

Plant 50cm tall, spread 45cm, erect, much branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, light green. Flower stem 55cm long, erect, slender, very slightly hollow at tip. Flowers freely produced, 8cm diameter, semi-double, compact, held above the foliage. Flowers Orange-Red Group N30A flushed with Orange-Red Group N30B. Ray petals 3cm long, 1cm wide, inflexed although tips slightly reflexed. Disc receptacular scales Orange-Red Group 31A, deeply laciniate, corolla lobes of disc florets enlarged, densely pubescent, colour between Yellow-Orange Group 17A and 17B. 50 % flowering from 08 July 2002.

*Glowing orange. Uniform height.*

**Zinnia (Dreamland Series) 'Dreamland Yellow' AGM (H3) 29 August 2002**

Raised and sent by Takii Europe BV. Votes 7 for with 2 against. [Trial No. 13]

Plant 50cm tall, spread 45cm, erect, compact, much branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, light to medium green. Flower stem 50cm long, erect, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 7cm diameter, inconsistently semi-double, compact, held at many different heights. Flowers a colour close to Yellow-Orange Group 17A/B. Ray petals 3cm long, 1cm wide, slightly inflexed. Disc 2cm diameter, receptacular scales Yellow-Orange Group 17C, laciniate, corolla lobes of disc florets enlarged, densely pubescent, similar yellow to the ray florets. 50% flowering from 15 July 2002.

*Rich golden yellow. Good leaf colour. Varying degree of doubleness.*

**Zinnia Oklahoma Series, mixed AGM (H3) 10 September 2002**

Raised and sent by Ernst Benary Samenzucht GmbH, also sent by Suttons Seeds. Votes 12 for with 2 against. [Trial Nos. 86 and 91]

Plant 100cm tall, spread 50cm, erect. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, medium green. Flower stem 90cm, erect, slender, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 4.5-7cm diameter, semi-double, compact, held well above the foliage. Flowers a mixture of colours including variations and blends of white, yellow, apricot, orange, red, bright pink and pale pink. Ray petals 1.3-2.4cm long, 0.8-1.4cm wide, inflexed, occasionally the tips are slightly reflexed. Disc 1-3cm diameter. 50 % flowering from 15 July 2002.

*Good colour balance and composition. Mix includes white, yellows, peaches, various oranges, red, pinks and shades in between.*

**Zinnia (Peter Pan Series) 'Peter Pan Gold' AGM (H3) 29 August 2002**

Sent by Ball Colegrave. Votes 8 for with 1 against. [Trial No. 15]

Plant 55cm tall, spread 45cm, erect, compact, little branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, light to medium green. Flower stem 55cm long, erect, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 8cm diameter, semi-double appearing double, compact, held well above the foliage. Flowers Yellow-Orange Group 17A. Ray petals 3cm long, 0.8cm wide, slightly inflexed, tips sharply reflexed. Disc 1.2cm diameter, receptacular scales a colour close to Yellow-Orange Group 16A. 50 % flowering from 27 June 2002.

*Very floriferous. Lots of very solid golden yellow colour. Varying degree of doubleness.*

**Zinnia (Profusion Series) 'Profusion Orange' AGM (H3) 29 August 2002**

Raised by Sakata, sent by Samuel Yates. Votes 8 for with 0 against. [Trial No. 24]

Plant 40cm tall, spread 35cm, erect, compact, much branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, matt, medium green with a hint of blue, bristly. Flower stem 50cm, erect, stout, bristly, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 7cm diameter, semi-double, loose, held at and above the foliage. Flowers Orange-Red group N30B with lines of N30A, fades to N30D. Ray petals 2.5cm long, 1cm wide, flat, edges rolled inwards at very base. Disc 2cm diameter, receptacular scales Orange Group N25C, corolla lobes of disc florets enlarged, densely pubescent, Orange group N25C. 50% flowering from 11 July 2002.

*Bright even orange colour. Consistent over long season. Dies gracefully.*

**Zinnia (Profusion Series) 'Profusion White' AGM (H3) 24 September 2002**

Sent by Samuel Yates. Votes 11 for with 3 against. [Trial No. 7]

Plant 55cm tall, spread 50cm, erect, compact, much branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, light yellowish green. Flower stem 58cm long, erect, slender, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 6cm diameter, single, loose, held well above the foliage. Flowers a colour in between Green-White Group 157A and 157B. Ray petals 2.2cm long, 1.2cm wide, flat. Disc 1.5cm diameter, yellow. 50% flowering from 22 July 2002.

*Clean white. Good contrast with yellow centres. Good habit although slightly uneven.*

**Zinnia (Short Stuff Series) 'Short Stuff Orange' AGM (H3) 10 September 2002**

Raised by Goldsmith, sent by Ball Colegrave. Votes 15 for with 1 against. [Trial No. 19]

Plant 40cm tall, spread 35cm, erect, compact, much branched. Leaves sessile, partially clasping, medium-dark green. Flower stem 40 cm long erect, stout, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 8cm diameter, semi-double, compact, held well above the foliage. Flowers Orange-Red Group N25B and Orange-Red Group N30D. Ray petals 2.8cm long, 1.1 cm wide, inflexed. Disc 1.5cm diameter, receptacular scales a colour close to Orange-Red Group 31A, corolla lobes of disc florets yellow. 50 % flowering from 27 June 2002.

*Cheerful light bright orange colour. Good height. Weather resistant. Hides dead heads well.*

**Zinnia (Starbright Series) 'Starbright Orange' AGM (H3) 10 September 2002**

Raised and sent by PanAmerican Seed. Votes 11 for with 3 against. [Trial No. 23]

Plant 40cm tall, spread 40cm, erect, little branched. Leaves very slightly clasping, medium blue green. Flower stem 42cm long, erect, slender, hollow at top. Flowers freely produced, 2.3-4cm diameter, single, loose, held well above the foliage. Flowers Orange Group N25C flushed at edges with Orange Group N25B. Ray petals 1.5cm long, 0.9cm wide, flat to slightly inflexed. Disc 0.9cm diameter, very insignificant, same colour as ray petals. 50 % flowering from 22 July 2002.

*Small flowered. Uniform bright yellow orange colour. Variable height. Narrow dark foliage.*

**H3** Plants hardy outside in some regions or in particular situations or which, whilst usually grown outside in summer, need frost free protection in winter.
