### Aim of the SSS

The showcase aims to raise awareness of Sustainable Schools and to bring together organisations that can give practical solutions to achieve it.

The showcase has four main elements:

- **Exhibitors** from over 100 organisations
- For **adults** - talks from national and local speakers on all the 'doorways' of sustainable schools
- For **school councils / eco-committees** - workshops and demonstrations
- For **secondary students** - exhibitors and speakers around green careers

The showcase is about gaining information in an inspirational and fun way whilst motivating schools to become more sustainable.

### Who should attend?

The showcase is **free**, and open to students representing their school council or eco-committee; secondary students interested in a green career, and any adults who support schools to become more sustainable:

- Primary, secondary and special headteachers and teachers
- Governors
- School business managers / bursars
- Caretakers and site managers
- Parent associations
- Extended schools co-ordinators
- Managers of early years settings
- Council officers and other organisations associated with any of the eight doorways

### Key features of the day

In addition, school staff, governors and parents should be interested in talks from Dr Paul Warwick from Leicester University; Bryan Davies from Ofsted; advice on cutting carbon and bills, fundraising with PTA-UK and Sustainable Procurement.

Students should enjoy the mountain bike displays, music workshops, cooking workshops, Forest Schools activities, climbing wall and workshops happening in all the 'eight doorways'.

Secondary students are also invited to hear from various organisations about green careers.
